## Description

The Little Free Libraries will bring little libraries to Buffalo's Masten District.

- The libraries will be centered specifically in the historic Hamlin Park neighborhood.
- Encourage independent education and community engagement.
- Promote neighborhood recreational space.
- Promote other civic qualities such as word-of-mouth marketing, grassroots organization, and recycling.
- Users will be free to leave a book and take a book as they wish. Individual or group donations from neighbors, schools, and organizations accepted. No costs or registration necessary.

#### Who(m) Does this Benefit?

This project would benefit families and neighbors on Buffalo's East Side, particularly those who wish to encourage independent learning and self-reliance.

#### **Estimated Budget**

The total cost of the program should not exceed \$10,000.

- Design, Build, and Assembly: \$250 (minimum) \$300 (maximum) X 10 items = \$2,500 \$3,000
- Accessories: \$50 X 10 items = \$500
- Installation: \$400 (minimum) \$500 (maximum) X 10 items = \$4,000 \$5,000
- Total (before Sales Tax): \$7,000 (minimum); \$8,500 (maximum)




